- 3) Principal's Report on school items (Roger King)
 - Reading Elementary Receive an A (Exemplary) @ 72.0%
 - The district is moving over to Letters to help all learn how to read using these concepts
 - Reading Elementary's overall rating is higher than the district and the state.
 - We discussed the robots that the school has, but we currently do not have anyone with the skillset to oversee that. Have a meeting in January. Roger King will reach out and look into possibly partnering with the Jr High or High School.

 - 1. Crosswalk Update (Jenny Pitt)
 - i) We discussed the steps and threshold needed to qualify for a hot signal. One con, if granted: removal of the 20 miles per hour signs.
 - ii) We will wait to ask for the study in the Spring Not enough foot traffic outside of school time now.
 - 2. We will need to have a meeting and discuss the issue with the community and the pros and cons of this change.
